# SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE IRON WORKERS PENSION PLAN OF WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA

This is a summary of the annual report for the Iron Workers Pension Plan of Western Pennsylvania, Employer Identification Number 25-1283169, for the period January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

## BASIC FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Benefits under the Plan are provided by a Trust. Plan expenses were \$20,323,166. These expenses included \$601,018 in administrative expenses, \$762,229 in investment management fees, and \$18,959,919 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries. A total of 3,010 persons were participants in or beneficiaries of the Plan at the end of the Plan year, although not all of these persons had yet earned the right to receive benefits.

The net assets of the Plan, after subtracting liabilities, was \$196,078,215, as of December 31, 2018, compared to \$196,728,378, as of January 1, 2018. During this period, the Plan experienced a decrease in its net assets of \$650,163. This decrease included unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of the Plan's assets; that is, the difference between the value of the Plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year.

Including employer contributions of \$22,497,639, net loss from investments of \$6,698,042, and unrealized appreciation of assets of \$3,873,406, the Plan had a total income of \$19,673,003.

### MINIMUM FUNDING STANDARDS

An Actuary's statement shows that enough money was contributed to the Plan to keep it funded in accordance with the minimum funding standards of ERISA.
